

POST-OP WOUND CARE

1. Supplies: You will need to purchase the following

- A. Non-Adherent Pads (telfa), Tape **OR** Oversized bandages
- B. Q-Tips, Anti-bacterial soap (Example: unscented Dial), Hydrogen Peroxide
- C. Vaseline **OR** Aquaphor **OR** Polysporin

2. Wound Care:

- A. Clean wound daily beginning **24 - 48** hours after the procedure, with a gentle anti-bacterial soap and water.
- B. Clean the wound with Q-Tips soaked in Hydrogen Peroxide **ONCE a week IF dry blood** is present. Do not reuse Q-Tips.
- C. After cleaning, apply a **GENEROUS** amount of any of the following: **Polysporin Ointment, Vaseline or Aquaphor** to surgical sight with a Q-Tip.
- D. Cover your wound with the following dressing:
 - 1. Non-adherent pad cut to the size of the wound.
 - 2. Secure the dressing with tape.**OR**
 - 1. Oversized bandage cut to the size of the wound.
- E. Continue wound care until stitches are removed or as the doctor directs.
- F. Moderate swelling and bruising at the surgical site **IS TO BE EXPECTED** unless signs of infection are present.

3. Avoid the following:

- A. Swimming is NOT allowed until sutures are removed.
- B. Heavy lifting and exercise are NOT allowed until the sutures are removed.
- C. Alcohol should be avoided for two days.
- D. Avoid taking any aspirin or aspirin containing products or blood thinners for the next 1-2week(s). **Please check with your prescribing doctor prior to stopping ANY medication.**

4. Prescriptions:

- A. You will be given a prescription for an oral antibiotic **IF** you have any artificial hips, knees, or joints, or if you have an increased risk of infection.
- B. Unless the doctor states otherwise, take Tylenol for pain as needed.

5. Contact the doctor if the following occurs:

- A. Bleeding which saturates your dressing (SPOTTING EXPECTED). To stop bleeding, hold direct pressure over the dressing for 20 minutes. Do not remove the dressing.
- B. Temperature greater than 100°F or 38°C.
- C. **SIGNS OF INFECTION-** redness, foul smelling drainage, swelling, pain or area is warm when touched.
